MILWAUKEE (November 15, 2011) – Mount Mary College will offer a free lecture on diversity issues on Wednesday, November 30, 2011, at 7 p.m. in Stiemke Hall, located on the second floor of Notre Dame Hall on Mount Mary's campus. The event is free and open to the public.

The lecture, "Personal Stories of American Indian Women Community Leaders" will be presented by a panel of representatives from the First Nation's Women's Professional Group. The panel members are:
