**Robert Burleigh** has published poems, reviews, essays, filmstrips, videos, and more than 30 children's books over the past 35 years. He is a graduate of DePauw University and holds an MA in humanities from the University of Chicago. His books vary from stories geared for pre-schoolers to survival stories to biographies for young adults and adults. Burleigh also paints regularly under the name Burleigh Kronquist and has shown work in one-person and group shows in Chicago, New York, and around the country.

**Sandra Keiser** is chairperson of the Mount Mary College Fashion Department where she has worked for over 30 years. She began writing in the early 1990s by co-authoring a fashion column for the *Milwaukee Journal's Wisconsin Magazine* and later a column in *BeadStyle Magazine*. She also co-authored the 2003 textbook *Beyond Design: The Synergy of Apparel Product Development*. Her second textbook, preliminarily titled *Ethical Design*, will highlight apparel supply chain businesses that emphasize ethical design and production, combining her “passion for fashion” with the foundational values of Mount Mary College.

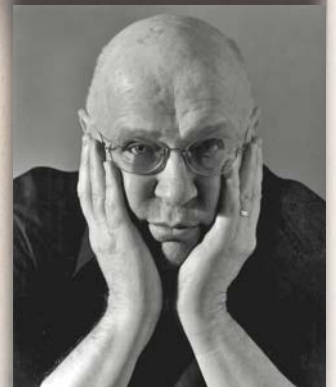
**Ann Bausum** writes about U.S. history for young people, including her 2007 works *Muckrakers* and *Our Country's First Ladies*. Her newest book, *Denied, Detained, Deported: Stories from the Dark Side of American Immigration*, will appear in April 2009. Other books examine social justice issues—including the 72-year-long fight for women's voting rights (*With Courage and Cloth*, 2004) and the Civil Rights struggle (*Freedom Riders*, named Booklist magazine's 2006 best youth nonfiction book.) Ann's other works also have earned numerous awards and recognition. Ann is a graduate of Beloit College.
