# History

The History and Political Science Department at Mount Mary College introduces students to an exploration of the record of human experience, helping them develop insights into issues that have confronted individuals, the choices they have made, and the consequences of those choices.

Courses are designed to develop a keen awareness, understanding and appreciation of the experiences and achievements of men and women from the past and present.

Studying history enables students to develop an informed approach to the political, social, and moral issues of society, as a discriminating citizen of the nation and the world.

At Mount Mary College, history majors study the people and history of United States, Western and non-Western societies, from political, social and cultural perspectives. History and political science are examined within the context of an integrated society, rather than as separate elements unrelated to overall social development.

A degree in history can open the door to fascinating and rewarding careers and provide a strong foundation of knowledge to spark a quest for life-long learning.
