Occupational Therapy

Occupational therapy is a dynamic health profession that focuses on redesigning daily occupations to maximize independence in living. It is the science of using “occupation,” meaning activities with specific goals, to help reduce physical and psychosocial disability.

Occupational therapists provide service to individuals of all ages who have physical, developmental or psychosocial deficits. Working as a vital member of the health care team, the occupational therapist uses purposeful activity in a variety of settings. Occupational therapists may work with those having disabilities such as cardiac or neurological impairments, arthritis, physical injuries, developmental problems or emotional disturbances.

The occupational therapy program of Mount Mary College is designed to provide a well-rounded professional education to develop skilled, hands-on practitioners who are client-centered and holistic in their approach to health care.

Combined BS/MS program

Mount Mary students complete a five-year program leading to a combined bachelor of science and master of science degree (BS/MS). The curriculum provides professional preparation with an emphasis on the liberal arts. The program emphasizes the biological, behavioral, and social sciences.

Students complete a four-year undergraduate program on campus that focuses on individual treatment and then participate in a faculty-arranged fieldwork experience for six months, putting textbook knowledge and theory into practice. Mount Mary’s occupational therapy students benefit from “learning by doing” — by engaging in experiential learning in laboratory settings, both on campus and in clinical situations.

The five-year combined BS/MS program reflects a current trend in the occupational therapy profession. The program provides students increased exposure to concepts in occupational therapy theory and practice, developed in response to changes in health care practice.

Fieldwork experiences

Fieldwork experiences provide ample opportunities for students to apply their educational background to clinical practice. Concurrent with their fieldwork placement, students access the Internet for distance learning to complete one year of graduate study, focusing on the student’s preferred practice area.

The entire curriculum design is organized around a developmental, educational philosophy with core expectations identified at each level. Mount Mary’s Occupational Therapy Department is committed to educating students who can grow in:

- reflective clinical reasoning
- evidence-based practice
- life-long learning

Career Opportunities

Occupational therapists work in settings such as rehabilitation clinics, hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, schools, early intervention programs, sheltered workshops and other community agencies. Some occupational therapists establish their own private practice.

Certification

Students must pass a certification exam to obtain a license to practice. The National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) develops the examination to certify the attainment of an entry-level knowledge base for practice. A felony or illness that is considered a potential danger to the public may prevent an individual from practice in occupational therapy.

Accreditation

The occupational therapy program has maintained full accreditation since 1941 and provides a professional education resulting in skilled hands-on practitioners who are client-centered and holistic in their approach to health care.

The occupational therapy program at Mount Mary College is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) located at the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA).

Mount Mary's admission policy specifies minimum criteria and procedures used to determine the eligibility of a candidate. The cumulative grade point for admission is no less than 3.0.
