



**DEGREE COMPLETION AGREEMENT BETWEEN
GATEWAY TECHNICAL COLLEGE AND MOUNT MARY COLLEGE**

Effective November 1, 2009

The purpose of this degree completion agreement is to provide a seamless transfer process for learners at Gateway Technical College who desire further education to enter Mount Mary College. Through the collaborative efforts of faculty, student services, and administration, learners will encounter a clear path to reach their educational goals.

Learners who successfully complete a Gateway degree and who meet the admission requirements of Mount Mary College and any other conditions specified in this agreement will be admitted to the designated program at Mount Mary College with up to 64 credits toward their degree.

NOTE: Mount Mary College and Gateway also have articulation agreements for general studies transfer certificate, accounting, business management, criminal justice – law enforcement, graphic communications, and interior design. Unless otherwise noted, a grade of C (2.0) or better at Gateway is required for credits to transfer to Mount Mary College.

PROGRAM TO PROGRAM INFORMATION FOR ANY A.A.S. DEGREE TO LIBERAL STUDIES

Students must complete an A.A.S. degree at Gateway in order to be eligible for admission to the Mount Mary College Liberal Studies program.

A maximum of 64 credits from a combination of the student’s occupational program requirements and other course work will be accepted for transfer. For pre-approved courses, please refer to the Mount Mary College Core Transfer List in this agreement.

801-136 English Composition I or 801-195 Written Communications will transfer as SYM 101 Composition I (3 elective credits).

Additional liberal studies course work to be completed at Mount Mary College:

Additional graduation requirements to be fulfilled at Mount Mary College:

1. **Graduation Requirement.** A total of 128 credits are required to graduate. Credits may include transfer credits. The last 32 credits must be earned at Mount Mary.
2. **Core Courses.** 48 credits must be earned in the Core. See Core Transfer List below.
3. **Math Competency.** Math competency can be fulfilled by achieving a passing score on a competency test at Mount Mary College, by earning a grade of C or better in one of the following math courses at Gateway Technical College:

804-106 Introduction to College Math
 804-123 Math with Business Applications
 804-113 College Technical Math 1A
 804-197 College Algebra & Trigonometry w/ Apps.

or by earning a grade of C or better in a specific math course at Mount Mary. Transfer students with more than 60 credits must fulfill this requirement within their first 16 credits at Mount Mary.

4. **Global Competency.** All Mount Mary students are required to take one course (3-4 credits) in a “global designated” course. Generally this requirement is fulfilled at Mount Mary.
