Program to Program Articulation Agreement for Direct Admission from a UW System 2-year College to the Mount Mary College Education Department

To be directly admitted into the Mount Mary College education department, students must have

1. a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher on at least 40 credits of collegiate level work as determined by Mount Mary,
2. achieved acceptable performance on the pre-professional skills test (PPST) as determined by WDPI,
3. completed the application process.
