Mount Mary College Coach Named Co-Coach of the Year

Head Volleyball Coach Kelsi Miller Honored by Association of Division III Independents

MILWAUKEE (December 21, 2010) – Kelsi Miller, Head Volleyball Coach and Assistant Athletic Director at Mount Mary College, has been named 2010 All-Independent Women’s Volleyball Co-Coach of the Year by the Association of Division III Independents (AD3I). Under Miller’s leadership, the Blue Angels achieved their first winning season on record and nearly doubled their wins each season since she joined Mount Mary in 2008.

Previously, Miller spent two and a half years as the assistant volleyball coach at Utah Valley University, a NCAA Division I program. In her first year there she helped lead the Wolverines to an 18-11 overall record and Division I Independent Tournament Championship. In 2006, Miller assisted the Wolverines to a 17-11 record and a runner-up position in the Division I Independent Tournament Championships.

“We’re very pleased that Kelsi’s talents have been recognized by AD3I,” stated Janae Magnuson, Mount Mary’s Director of Athletics and Head Softball Coach. “Her coaching expertise and commitment to our athletic program continue to improve our teams’ performance,” she added.

The AD3I consists of 13 Division III independent institutions that have joined together to recognize student-athletes at independent institutions, and to provide exempted postseason championship competition.
