**Mount Mary College President Named Recipient of  
“Women Putting Their Stamp on Milwaukee” Award**

MILWAUKEE (January 26, 2011) – Dr. Eileen Schwalbach, President of Mount Mary College, has been named a recipient of the 2011 “Women Putting Their Stamp on Milwaukee” Award from the United States Postal Service (USPS). The 13<sup>th</sup> annual award recognizes women from the Metro Milwaukee Area with outstanding achievements in several fields. President Schwalbach is being honored for her contributions in the area of education.

Dr. Schwalbach began her career at Mount Mary in 1993. She held several academic leadership positions until being named President in February 2009. In addition to her responsibilities at Mount Mary, she actively advocates for the improvement of education in the Milwaukee community. She serves as Co-Chair of the Greater Milwaukee Committee’s Talent Divided Initiative, a national effort to drive economic prosperity through education attainment. She also serves on the board of directors for Milwaukee Achiever Literacy Services. Her contributions to the organization were acknowledged with the receipt of Milwaukee Achiever Literacy Service’s 2009 Legacy Award.

Additional boards served on include PAVE (Parents Advancing Values in Education), Milwaukee Academy of Science and St. Joan Antida High School. Dr. Schwalbach also recently championed the launch of an AmeriCorps VISTA program at Notre Dame Middle School, a school serving Hispanic girls on Milwaukee’s south side. Sponsored by Mount Mary, and staffed with Mount Mary student volunteers, the program provides English language tutoring to family members.
