### **Mount Mary College “Writers on Writing” Series to Present Award-Winning Poet and Author Meg Kearney**

**MILWAUKEE** (March 7, 2011) – Mount Mary College will present author and award-winning poet Meg Kearney as its “Writers on Writing” guest on Wednesday, March 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. in Helfaer Hall. Helfaer Hall is located in the first floor of Caroline Hall at 2900 N. Menomonee River Parkway, Milwaukee.

Kearney’s first book of poetry, *An Unkindness of Ravens*, is about becoming an adult in an Irish-American home. Her work has been featured on Garrison Keillor’s “A Writer’s Almanac” and her poem *Home By Now* will be included in Garrison Keillor’s next *Good Poems* anthology due out in fall 2011. The collection was also a winner of the 2010 PEN New England LL Winship Award and a finalist for the Paterson Poetry Prize and *Foreword Magazine*’s Book of the Year.

Kearney is also author of *The Secret of Me*, a novel in verse for teens. In 2012, Scholastic will publish her picture book, *Trouper the Three-Legged Dog*, illustrated by E.B. Lewis. Her story “Chalk” will also appear in *Fresh Flash: Short Short Stories About Youth*, forthcoming from Persea Books. Her nonfiction essay, “Hello, Mother, Goodbye,” appears in *The Movable Nest: A Mother/Daughter Companion*.

Kearney is Director of the Solstice Low-Residency MFA in Creative Writing Program at Pine Manor College in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts. More information about her can be found at [www.megkearney.com](http://www.megkearney.com).
