Mount Mary College Commencement to Take Place May 19, 2012

Entrepreneur, U.S. Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Chair Nina Vaca to deliver address

MILWAUKEE, WI (May 14, 2012) – Mount Mary College will conduct its commencement ceremonies on Saturday, May 19, 2012 at 11:00 a.m. in the College’s Bloechl Recreation Center located at 2900 N. Menomonee River Parkway, Milwaukee. Undergraduate degrees representing 25 majors will be conferred on approximately 150 students. Graduate degrees representing seven programs will be conferred on approximately 115 students. Eight certificates representing three areas of certification will also be awarded. The 270 degrees to be conferred in May combine with 150 degrees in December for a total of 420 for the 2011-2012 academic year.

Nina Vaca, Founder, Chairman and CEO of Pinnacle Technical Resources Inc., will deliver the keynote address and will receive an honorary Doctor of Laws degree. Vaca’s Dallas-based staffing and managed services firm recruits and manages contingent labor for a broad variety of Fortune 500 companies. Under Vaca’s leadership, Pinnacle has received over 38 national and local awards during the past seven years including consecutive top rankings in the Inc. 500, and *Staffing Industry Report*.
